
## Synod News


### Forest Church

One way of connecting to the natural environment is to set up, or join, a forest church. Forest church is a way of being church outdoors, in natural surroundings, where people can engage with God in a different way. Forest churches are attractive to people who find they can connect more easily with God in the outdoors than in a church building. The focus is on re-connecting people with God and the natural environment. They are usually all age gatherings, meeting regularly during the year. Services involve worship and fellowship in the same way as a church in a building but often include extra activities specific to the outdoors. There is no set way of organising a forest church, it could, for example, be focused around a walk, a meal or a singalong. Neither is there a set place to meet, it can be a woodland, a park or garden. Some forest churches celebrate the Celtic festivals through the year, from Candlemas, to Mayday, Lammas and all Hallows, and then starting again with Epiphany.

If you lead, or attend, a forest church where you are, please let us know by emailing Colleen, so that we can put the information on the website. If you are interested in setting up a forest church we can suggest resources to help you do that.





### **Temporary Lumen Centre Manager**

Thames North Synod are looking to recruit an innovative and inspiring person to manage the Lumen Centre as a key resource facility for the Synod and to grow a Christian presence and witness there as we continue to develop a vision for the building.

The Lumen Centre is located in Central London (Tavistock Place). The Lumen Centre is a building that is strategically situated to play a key role in the development of the surrounding community, building bridges with local people and other churches as well as offering opportunities for worship and discipleship.

The postholder will have responsibility for overseeing the running and use of the building, and will work closely with the Synod Discipleship Enabler, Training Officer, Children and Youth Development Officer and other Synod staff members to make the most effective use of the

building for the Synod. They will also help to continue to grow a Christian presence and witness.

This is a full-time post (37.5 Hours) requiring some flexibility in the pattern of hours worked, with a fixed term contract of 2 years at a salary of circa £35,000 - £40,000 per annum based on experience.
