A Special Invitation



In 2001, David Jonathan, called Johny, was invited as a CWM-URC Partner to work with Grassroots Luton and the Luton Council of Faiths. His mission was to promote peace, justice, reconciliation, and to develop interfaith initiatives that embraced all sections of the community and all age groups.

Since then, Johny's work has been widely recognised, earning him numerous awards and accolades.

This year, Johny was honoured to receive a special invitation to a Christmas Reception at 10 Downing Street on Wednesday, 10th December. The event was held to thank Christians from diverse denominations and backgrounds who are actively engaged in voluntary service within their local communities.

Guests enjoyed mulled wine and canapés, accompanied by music and participatory carol singing led by a small community choir.

Rev. Baroness Maeve Sherlock, Minister of State for Work and Pensions in the House of Lords, led the gathering in prayer.


Jasmine Mitchell, winner of the 2025 Great British Bake Off, spoke about the importance of hospitality. She reminded everyone how food has the power to bring people together across divides, encouraging us to follow Jesus' example by sharing meals with others—especially in today's climate of polarisation and division.

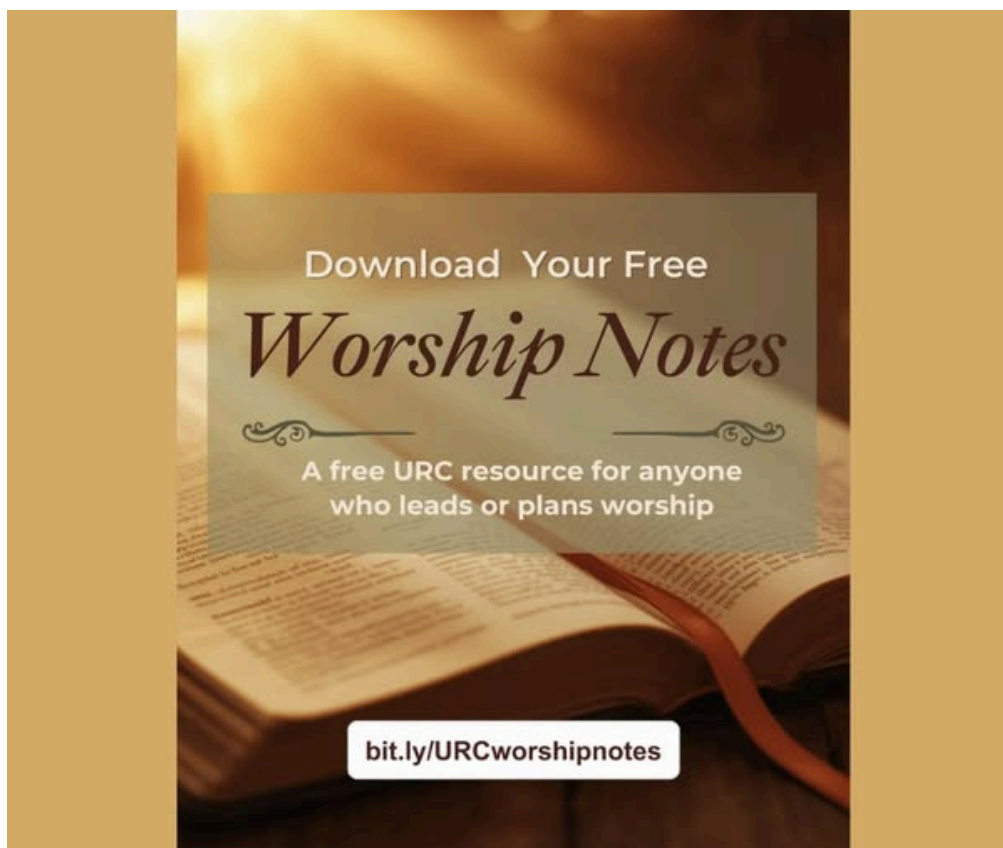
MP Steve Reed addressed the guests on behalf of the Prime Minister, who had been delayed by a phone call with President Trump and President Zelenskyy. Reed expressed gratitude for the contributions of all those present, affirming the government's recognition of the vital role churches and faith communities play in bringing hope, wellbeing, and reconciliation to society.

Following his call, the Prime Minister made a brief appearance. Johny was honoured to spend thirty seconds with him, including a warm and welcoming handshake.

Reflecting on the occasion, Johny said:

"I feel humbled and grateful to receive this invitation. As encouraged by the Prime Minister and all those I met at 10 Downing Street, I remain committed to celebrating Christmas by loving God and loving our neighbours. May our Christmas celebrations reflect Christ's message of peace and goodwill to all humankind."

Peter Musgrave of the Vine Church says: Over the past few days I have been experimenting with a pop up mini exhibition called *Christ in the Rubble*. It is based on the situation in Palestine, where cities have been reduced to rubble and on Bethlehem where Palestinians are increasingly struggling.

I have also made a mini manger in a small box full of rubble and put some nativity figures in the box and then taken the mini exhibition to churches I am attending during advent events.

I wondered if people from other URC churches would like to make their own Christ in the Rubble exhibition. It is very easy to find images to use.

**Fund a National Climate Resilience
Plan: protect communities from
climate impact**

From floods to extreme temperatures, climate impacts risk damaging homes, health, businesses, services, and the economy. We want Government to prioritise adaptation; fund a new Resilience Plan that works with nature and includes public education, infrastructure standards, and local funding.

We believe Government plans are failing us: what we see as a lack of preparation puts the UK's life-support systems at risk and a focus on short-term fixes like concrete flood walls distract from deeper threats. We think a joined-up national strategy must include local funding, upland & urban flood prevention, community resilience, ecologically sound infrastructure, housing, health, food & water security. We believe that as risks grow, without strategic action, communities face devastation, so adaptation isn't optional and must be a policy priority.

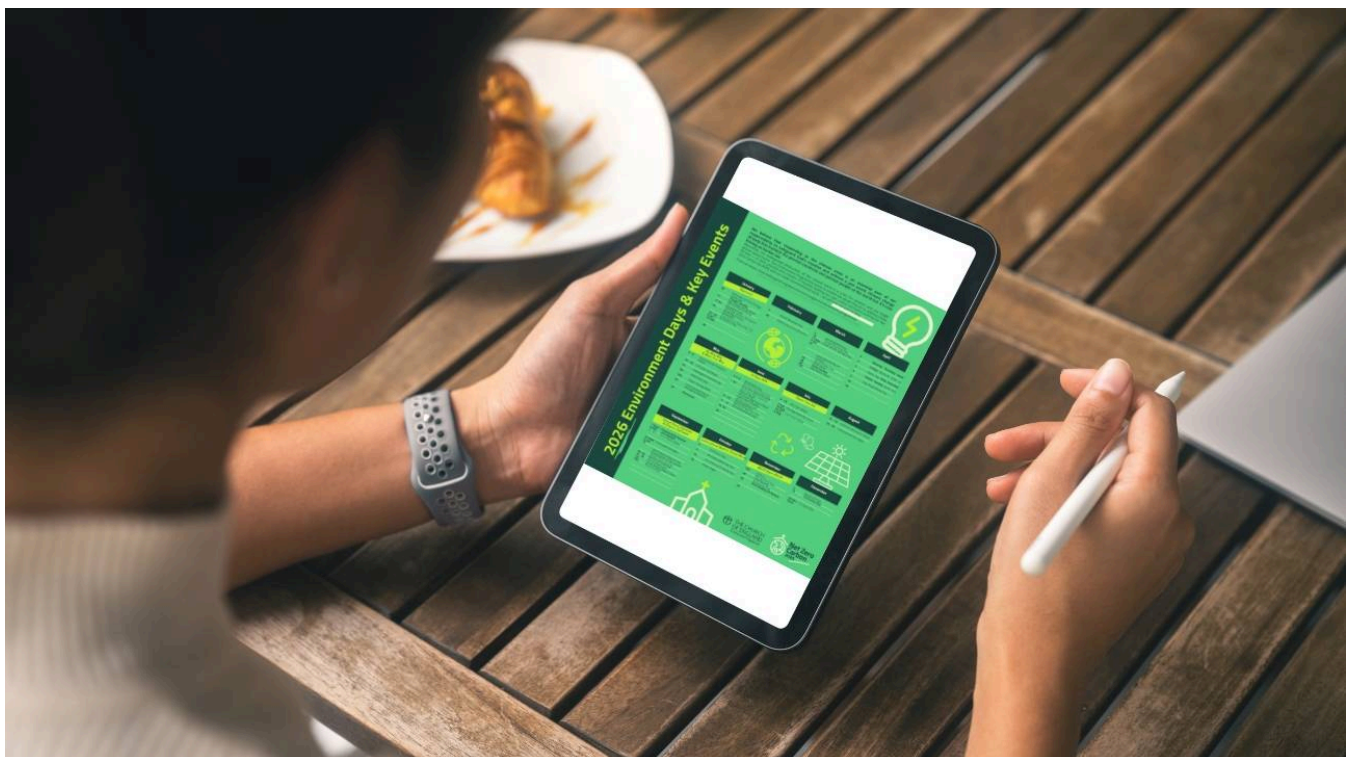

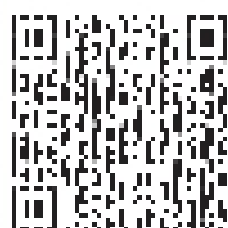
