Bibles and Baptism in India



*Last year's wheelchair distribution to India blessed many with the gift of freedom, including **Bidyut, who got baptised this year** during a Roofbreaker mission in Kolkata.*

This year's Roofbreaker team who visited Kolkata, India, met two people who received mobility aids and Bibles from Wheels for the World, and

heard the impact on their lives...

The team met Paulina, who is blind and received a Bengali audio Bible in 2025. Paulina's husband died so she lives with a Hindu family who go to work, leaving her alone during daytimes.

Paulina says, "I had no knowledge of the Bible. Now I'm reading this, chapter by chapter, and it's so helpful to me. I'm happy that I spend my time with the Word of God. Nobody is here throughout the day, but I'm not alone. The Word of God is with me. I'm very happy, very glad, at receiving this gift. Many, many thanks to you." Paulina's favourite Bible passage is Jesus calming the storm. She says, "When the storm comes in our lives and we get anxious, we're given assurance that Jesus is in our boat."

The UK team delivered training to church and ministry leaders in Kolkata, emphasising the Gospel call to include disabled people in the body of Christ.

Meeting on AI Generated Complaints Thursday 10 September, Online

Churches are dealing with an increase in AI-generated complaints. Current guidance via the Charity Commission is outdated because of the speed at which AI is moving. There is also evidence that complaints are becoming a legal issue when, previously, complaints were dealt with without recourse to law. We understand the frustration and concern this is causing for members and thought an online meeting might be helpful for members to gain a better understanding of how best to prepare for this issue.

Jeremy Isaacson, a Partner at *Farrer & Co*, has kindly agreed to speak to us about how churches can best prepare for this new threat. Jeremy is a specialist in data protection and freedom of information law, and he regularly advises public authorities on request handling and dealing with complaints to the Information Commissioner's Office.

The meeting will be held online on **Thursday 10 September 2026 at 13:30**.

DBS Barring and Legal Duty to Refer Workshop

Tuesday 25 August • 10 AM - 12 PM GMT+1 online.

Did you know if you have staff or volunteers engaging in regulated activity (they have an enhanced with barred list DBS) check you have a

legal duty to refer to the DBS if you remove them from regulated activity due to harm or relevant conduct.

The workshop will cover:

- the benefits of DBS and your organisation working together
- what 'regulated activity' is
- when a DBS barring referral should be made, including when the legal duty is met
- the three different referral routes
- how to make a good quality referral
- the consequences of not making appropriate barring referrals
- the consequences of being included on one or both Barred Lists

Right to Work Scheme Information Events

The Home Office is hosting a series of practical information events to help employers understand and prepare for changes to the Right to Work (RtW) Scheme that will come into force on 1 October 2026.

The sessions will also cover the increasing use of digital immigration status and online checking services, and how employers can carry out compliant right to work checks to meet their legal responsibilities. Further information on the updated RtW Code of Practice is available [HERE](#).

All sessions will cover the same content, so there is no need to attend more than one.

Who should attend

The sessions are aimed at:

- employers in the UK of all sizes and sectors
- HR professionals
- recruitment teams
- staff responsible for conducting right to work checks

What the session will cover

The event will provide clear and practical guidance on:

- Changes to the Right to Work Scheme – Recent and upcoming changes following the public consultation, which closed in December 2025, and what these changes mean for employers in practice.
- Digital immigration status and eVisas – The transition from expired Biometric Residence Permits (BRPs), increased use of online right to work checks, and which documents remain acceptable evidence of a right to work.
- Completing a compliant right to work check – How to conduct checks correctly to establish and maintain a statutory excuse, including when employers should use the Employer Checking Service.
- Repeat checks – When follow-up checks are required for people who have time-limited permission to work in the UK.
- Compliance and enforcement – How to prevent illegal working while avoiding unlawful discrimination, maintaining appropriate records and reducing the risk of receiving a civil penalty.

These sessions will cover the same content as the original events, including upcoming changes to the Right to Work Scheme taking effect from 1 October 2026, digital immigration status and eVisas, compliant right to work checks, repeat checks, and employer compliance responsibilities.

They need to know how to promote the welfare of those they support, reduce the likelihood of harm, abuse or neglect, and respond effectively to concerns or allegations of abuse which arise.
