Sunday 9 February marked the 80th anniversary of a Nazi Germany V2 bomb landing by Church House, then known as Presbyterian Church House, in Tavistock Place, killing 10 people. May their souls forever rest in peace and the comfort of the Lord always be with their friends and families.

Could you join the Green Team for Thames North Synod?



The Synod Green Team met on Monday 10 February at St Albans (Greenwood site) and shared a working lunch to plan the Eco Day to be held there on Saturday 7 June and to reflect on other plans and activities.

We have been fortunate to have a team of eight people (5 Green Apostles and 3 supporters) and also to now receive the support of two members of Synod staff. However, a number of the team are due to stand down in March and so we are looking for new people to join us, as 'Green Apostle' or 'Green Team supporter'. The Green Team's work is to promote the URC and Synod Environmental Policies in ways that help us better care for God's creation in our worship, shared life and mission. In its first three years, the team has seen 23 churches in the Synod awarded Bronze or Silver from Eco Church, another 22 registered for the scheme, and the Synod itself reaching a Bronze Award. It has organised an annual Synod Green Day of sharing and celebration for adults and children. Two members have been recognised by the Carbon Literacy Project as qualified to facilitate their courses and are now offering these courses to local churches and members. Team members have also shared ideas with Synod committees and the URC's Green Apostles network and write regularly in the Synod e-news.

Could you help take the Team's work forward? There is room on the team for all sorts of perspectives and levels of commitment. The team meets online about four times a year (for an hour), with separate meetings for those planning events like the Green Day. Expenses can be covered by the Synod. 


