Heaton Way URC - Memories and Lessons Learned

This project was started by a small group following the closing service for Heaton Way Church on October 1st, 2023. It started as a booklet to share memories of the church that had meant so much to them over the years. The purpose of the project grew as it was felt that there were lessons that could be learned by all churches as we fight to keep our churches viable in a changing world.

The Moderator says of it 'It is always sad when a church closes. But what a wonderful testimony this account provides of the faithfulness of individuals in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and in action. Through the witness of the church, lives were touched and transformed. It is important that the story is shared to encourage disciples today and to give God the glory.'

A PowerPoint presentation on lessons learned from the closure of Heaton Way will be shown at synod on Saturday and is also available for download <u>here</u>. We hope the PowerPoint presentation will be useful in local Area Groups, individual churches or in Training Sessions. The seven members of the Group have expressed their willingness to come and be part of any such training or discussion sessions if invited.

Would you like to visit Sicily in October 2025?



The United Reformed Church Waldensian Fellowship has been organising visits to the Waldensian (Protestant) Church in Italy since 1980. This year we shall visit Sicily, an island of extraordinary history and beauty. We shall:

- Explore Palermo, the crowded and exotic capital of the island, and the Norman cathedral of Monreale
- Hear about the social and teaching work in a visit to La Noce, the Waldensian church's centre in the city
- spend some time in Servizio Cristiano, a Waldensian Church centre of education and agriculture, at Riesi in the deprived centre of the island
- visit Scicli, where the church is a centre for the support of migrants (and featured in the Montalbano television series)
- and finish in Siracusa, once the most important city in the Western world with a beautiful island centre
- on our journey we would visit historic sites such as the Greek temples at Agrigento.

The visit is expected to last ten nights, or thirteen for a longer stay in Siracusa. We will stay at Servizio Cristiano and in hotels.

At this stage we can only estimate a cost but ten nights should cost of the order of £1000 and thirteen nights £1200. Single rooms would cost more.

We will give more information as the details are worked out. Travel to and from Italy will not be included. Participants will have to arrange travel to Palermo and return from Siracusa or Catania.



Lent reading from the Green Team



An online A Rocha talk this week, The Green Heart of Mission, in which the London Institute of Contemporary Christianity (licc) leaflet 'Jesus died to save the planet' was discussed.

Our planet is at breaking point. There's no planet B, but there is hope for God's world. Because Jesus died to save the planet.

We're facing climate and ecological breakdown caused by human overconsumption. Rampant wildfires, tumbling biodiversity, and rapidly escalating temperatures are just a few reminders that our planet is at breaking point.

But all too often, the church treats protecting the earth as a 'nice-to-have' rather than a foundational outworking of the gospel. Urgent action is required, and that change must start in the church.

This powerful essay by Paul Kunert reclaims the foundational truth that the gospel is good news for the whole of creation. By focusing on human interests over all else God has made, we fail to recognise the full redemptive reach of Jesus' sacrifice. We need to embrace the full, holistic scope of the gospel – living in line with the truth that Jesus is King of all things, and came to save all he has made.


Read on to discover how you can make kingdom-like decisions in your everyday life that will help the earth flourish. Then share your new perspective with your church family, discuss how it'll shape your everyday choices, and advocate for changed messaging from the pulpit and in policy – for the good of the whole planet and the glory of God.



CHRISTIANS IN THE HOLY LAND: CHALLENGES AND HOPES


A presentation by Bishop William Shomali, Patriarchal Vicar for Jerusalem and Palestine

Monday 31 March from 12pm

at Bloomsbury Central Baptist Church, 235 Shaftesbury Ave, London WC2H 8EP



Bishop William Shomali will share and answer questions on how the war and ceasefire conditions are affecting the daily life of Christians in the Holy Land, particularly in his pastoral area, Jerusalem and Palestine. Then drawing on his experience with local Christian Related Organisations (CROs) such as the Latin Patriarchate and Friends of the Holy Land, as well as his Palestinian heritage, will outline where there is hope for peace and economic recovery through the actions of this Christian community and these CROs which among other projects operate 93 schools, universities, and vocational centres, 19 healthcare facilities, 47 social protection institutions, 77 cultural and tourism centres, 38 youth and 21 local and international development agencies delivering a variety of services to hundreds of thousands of Palestinians as part of their Christian identity, witness and culture.

Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme (LPWGS): important deadline



The Historic Religious Buildings Alliance has just issued the following e-mail which we thought worth passing on:

"As you know, from 1 April 2025 there is a cap on VAT refunds under the LPWGS. The cap will limit a place of worship to a total VAT refund of £25k in the year (i.e. equivalent to a spend including VAT of £125k)

We have just heard that VAT claims need to be in by 31st March 2025 latest if they are to treated under the current rules - that is, without a cap applying.

If the claim is received on or after 1 April then the cap will apply even if the expenditure was incurred before that date.

So if you think the cap may apply to you, you should claim for as much as possible on or before 31 March. If the cap definitely won't apply to you, then there is no rush."


