

Is my property in danger from RAAC?

The vast majority of people were unfamiliar with RAAC until recently, when headlines of sudden school closures linked to the material brought it into public awareness for the first time. Now, people are wondering what RAAC is and why it might be so dangerous.

Reinforced autoclaved aerated concrete (RAAC) is a building material that was primarily used in the UK from the 1960s to 1990s. Similar to traditional concrete but much lighter due to its aerated structure – meaning it's filled with tiny holes – RAAC was mainly used in the construction of public sector buildings, like schools and courts of law, but can be found in other buildings, too. It was primarily used to build roofs, but can be found in walls and floors as well.

While it was initially favoured because of its lightweight and thermal insulating properties, as well as the fact that it was cheaper to

manufacture than traditional concrete, RAAC's one big drawback is its shelf life of just over 30 years. Its premature expiry date is due to RAAC's aerated composition, which absorbs moisture over time which then rusts adjacent metal structures. Over time, this means that buildings which contain RAAC are vulnerable to collapse. Buildings that are particularly at risk from collapse caused by RAAC are those with flat roofs.
