What is Jazz Vespers?

Jazz Vespers began in New York City in the late 50s, gravitating to St. Peter's Lutheran Church when Pastor John Gensel invited jazz musicians to provide the music at afternoon "Vespers" services. Attendees and performers included Ellington, Monk, Coltrane, Gillespie and many others and the style stretched from traditional jazz to gospel, rock, folk and more. In 1984 Scott Stroman began leading monthly JV services at St. Annes Lutheran Church in London, moving to the American International Church in 2022.

The word Vespers comes from the Latin for "evening" and it's simply an evening prayer service. We use the word because of the spiritual nature of the service and continuing the tradition of Jazz Vespers services.

Film 'Light'

Rev Maggie Hindley, retired minister from Thames North Synod, has done several spells with the Community Peacemaker Teams in Hebron over the years. She was unable to visit in 2024 due to the security position, but this film made then allows us insight into the Hebron situation and the work of the Peacemakers.

Maggie will be introducing the film, which focuses on two stories, Nisreen from Hebron city and Tareq in Masafer Yatta, South Hebron Hills, a pair who embody non-violent resistance and resilience. It is equally suitable for newcomers to the topic of Israel-Palestine and for those who are already familiar with the background.

All are welcome, and admission is free (donations to CPT are welcome) We should be delighted if you and others from your church can join us for the evening. Doors open with tea/coffee at 1815 and after the film there will be refreshments available before a Zoom link up to the film director in Hebron for a Q&A session.

A Workshop led by Julian Templeton and Francis Ackroyd

The number and type of hymns available to worship leaders and worshippers today is vast. What criteria does a worship leader use to select hymns? This workshop will include a discussion, with sung examples, of hymns that might be selected for their theology or rhythm or feeling, and how these hymns shape the moments of worship.

- A hymn selected for the theology/message of its words
- A hymn selected for the rhythm of its music
- A hymn selected for the feeling it evokes
