Repeatedly taking the easy choice on welfare



JPIT's Paul Morrison responds to potential disability benefit cuts. In the November 2024 budget the Chancellor decided to keep the last government's £3bn of disability benefit cuts which were pencilled in for the next three years. This was called a "difficult decision". Over the past week, the government was busily spinning that because "the world has changed" there are to be more difficult choices in the March 2025 financial statement. The world may have changed, but the difficult choice offered is remarkably similar – additional reductions in the living standards of the disabled. This time with cuts of between £2Bn and £7Bn.


This project was started by a small group following the closing service for Heaton Way Church on October 1st, 2023. It started as a booklet to share memories of the church that had meant so much to them over the years. The purpose of the project grew as it was felt that there were lessons that could be learned by all churches as we fight to keep our churches viable in a changing world.

The Moderator says of it 'It is always sad when a church closes. But what a wonderful testimony this account provides of the faithfulness of individuals in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and in action. Through the witness of the church, lives were touched and transformed. It is important that the story is shared to encourage disciples today and to give God the glory.'

A PowerPoint presentation on lessons learned from the closure of Heaton Way will be shown at synod on Saturday and is also available for download here. We hope the PowerPoint presentation will be useful in local Area Groups, individual churches or in Training Sessions. The seven

members of the Group have expressed their willingness to come and be part of any such training or discussion sessions if invited.

Climate Change and the URC Policy to Become an Anti-Racist Church



At Synod on 15th March, the book 'Climate Change is Racist' was recommended. The author Jeremy Williams was the main speaker at last June's exciting ECO Day held at Vine Church Ilford and attended by 100 people. He showed powerfully the difference between the countries of the North and those of the South, particularly Sub-Saharan Africa. In general those in the North, predominantly white, have caused much of the climate problem, and are suffered by the predominately black South Sub-Saharan countries. He describes this as structural racism - inequality laid down over the years by slavery, colonisation and imperialism. For example, page 15 shows that electricity consumption for a year, by the average person in Britain is 4,496 KWH, while in Madagascar the aversge person's consumption is 78 KWH. Droughts, famine, fires and floods have always occurred but the heavy production of carbon dioxide in the North

has greatly increased their severity in areas prone to such disasters, mainly in the South.

We encourage Synod members to read the book especially the strong case Jeremy makes for Reparations or Restorative Justice. It was clear at Synod that we as Thames North Synod are committed to both Climate Change issues and Racial Justice Reparations.


