Last Sunday the Moderator led worship at Christ Church, Hitchin in North Hertfordshire. One of the larger churches in the Synod, it is a URC/Methodist Church - it was formed from two Methodist Churches and a URC, building on a completely new site in the centre of Hitchin. With a wide age range the Moderator introduced them to interactive morning prayers starting with stretching to praise God (see picture). It was lovely to see the older folk from the Methodist Home which is situated next door enthusiastically joining in with the prayers and the actions for Our God is a great big God. The worship was enhanced by a Worship Group (including a versatile pianist and organist) enabling a range of contemporary songs and traditional hymns.

Spring School







Over 40 ministers and local leaders from Eastern and Thames North Synods gathered last week for the annual Spring School at the beautiful Highgate House Conference Centre near Northampton. The theme was Inter-related: Church as a community of difference. Hannah Fytche led the Bible Studies based on Romans inviting ministers to engage with Paul's letter in a fresh way.

Other speakers inspired the group covering Intersectional, Intercultural, Intergenerational, the Cross and the Crossroads. The threads were brought together by Robin Barden. Worship was led by the Moderators and other individuals. A quiz and a sing along of Assembly Bangers provided some light hearted entertainment.

Street Fathers-Luton launched to safeguard youth & tackle street crime



David Jonathan (Grassroots) reports in this week's Luton News Faith Matters Column:

Last year, there were approximately 50,000 offences involving knife crime in England and Wales. It is a significant concern, particularly for the safety and well-being of our young people. Deaths caused by knife crimes in Luton in recent years have brought Luton's diverse faith communities and public sector agencies to work together in tackling the issue.

Roselyn Forde, a member of St Andrew's Church on Biscot Road in Luton, has actively volunteered in the local community over the years. In the last few months, she has worked extremely hard to bring together individuals, communities and organisations to launch a local communityled initiative called 'Street Fathers-Luton'.
