On Sunday Wanstead URC celebrated their 160th anniversary. The service was led by their Minister Revd Dr Tessa Robinson with the Moderator, Revd George Watt preaching. The Mayor of Redbridge, Clllr Beverley Brewer attended the service along with many members and friends past and present.

The church began meeting in the Weavers' Almshouses. On Pentecost 1865 the church was formally constituted. They purchased the building of

St Luke's Church of England in Euston Road which although only 2 years old was going to be demolished to make way for St Pancras Station. It was moved and rebuilt stone by stone in Wanstead under the oversight of the original architect. Perhaps a unique instance of a church being moved in this way. An amazing example of recycling, faith and hope.

Important Reminder: Pray with the Synod on Mission



It has been said many times that it is not that the church has a mission but rather that the mission of God has a church and we are part of that as we seek use God given resources for mission in our area. You may be aware that we are seeking to progress our vision in Thames North Synod for creating new Christian communities and raising up and resourcing local workers to lead in this work. We have shared at previous Synod meetings about the offer of one of the new SCM pioneer ministers. We are at this stage seeking to look, listen and pray as we discern the way forward in a number of potential places and contexts. 


