

The Passion - Basic Information

What is The LAMPS Collective? We are professional artists with a shared Christian faith who create and tour live theatre and produce creative resources for the church. You can find more details here about us here www.lampscollective.com

What is The Passion? Performed by a cast of three talented professional actors, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus are recreated in a moving, memorable and ultimately joyful retelling of the Easter events.

Told from the perspectives of Peter, Mary Magdalene and a Roman centurion named

Marcus, The Passion leads us through the events of Holy Week, thecross and beyond.

As with all LAMPS shows, it has been written with people that don't normally go to church

in mind. It is suitable for adults and young people from age
11 upwards (so secondary school students). As well as being a clear
and powerful re-telling of the story, italso provides a
stimulating starting point fordiscussion and debate.

What is the

running time? The Passion lasts approximately 75 minutes

How much will it cost? There are two payment models available so you can choose the one that best suits your circumstances:

Model 1:A flat fee of £895 (plus travel expenses).

Model 2: One fee of £495 plus 50% of ticket sales (plus travel expenses).

We are always happy to talk through costs with you and will always do our best to make a

performance possible within your budget. A 20% deposit of the agreed fee is required at the point of booking.

What do you need to do to host a show? Very little! Just let people know it's

happening (we provide you with electronic publicity that you can tailor to your performance and print out as posters /fliers if required). We bring our own lighting and sound. If you need raised staging to help your audience see better, we can supply this for a small extra cost, equivalent to mileage for a second vehicle.

A Note for Advent from the Green Team - National Tree Week



At the beginning of Advent we enter into a waiting time. Nature too is in a waiting time, in-between growing seasons. For that reason it's a good time to plant, and, especially as this week is National Tree Week, it's a very good time to plant a tree. Trees come in all shapes and sizes so even if you don't have sufficient space for a tree at your church, you could even plant one in a pot. Trees are important for our well-being because they store carbon, prevent soil erosion, regulate temperatures, increase biodiversity and provide a home for wildlife.

If you can't plant a tree, encourage people in your church to take a woodland walk during Advent. It's an opportunity to appreciate the calming nature of trees and to connect with God. On woodland walks you can also collect some bits and pieces to decorate the church building during Advent, connecting the cosy indoors with the wintry outdoors.
