Silver Eco Church Award

It was formally presented by our minister the Rev Ian Green at our Harvest Festival service on September 29th.

A joyful and illuminating hymnsinging event



Last Saturday morning, 28 September, fourteen people gathered at The Lumen Community to hear the Revd Anne Sardeson's presentation based on her book 50 Hymns for 50 Years. Anne, who now ministers to three churches in Essex, was formerly Training and Development Officer for Thames North Synod. It was a thoroughly participative presentation, with all present invited to sing 10 hymns originating from the 16th to the 21st centuries, which Anne introduced. The accompanist was the Revd Francis Ackroyd, who also shared with us his experience, as a then young Minister, of how radically different some of the new tunes and words seemed in the 1960's.

Anne also shared a hymn that she had written during the pandemic lockdown Christmas of 2020. In response to personal loss and populist claims that Christmas had been "cancelled", Anne's hymn began: "It's hard to hear the angels sing when everything is different, it's hard to think of any news that's good. But Christmas is still here, and God is very near, for God remains when everything is strange."

Anne also included the hymns of three other Synod hymn writers: the Reverends Heather Whyte, Sue McCoan, and Dominic Grant. The first two were present at the event and introduced their hymns. Although Dominic could not be present, we sang a hymn he had written, which is the one on the screen in the photograph. It was an altogether joyful event, with Anne's illuminating introductions complemented by the glorious colours shining through the south-facing Fourmaintraux stained glass window.

Prepare Your Buildings for Winter: Essential Maintenance Tips



As winter approaches, it's crucial to ensure your buildings are ready to withstand the colder months. Simple maintenance checks and repairs can make a significant difference. The Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB) has compiled a list of their top ten tips to help you get started:

- **1. Check for Blocked Downpipes**: Inspect during heavy rain to identify any leaks. In dry weather, look for stained brickwork.
- **2. Clear Ground Level Gullies and Drains:** Ensure these are free of debris and clean them out if necessary.
- **3. Autumn Cleaning:** Remove plants, leaves, and silt from gutters, hopper heads, flat roofs, and drainage channels. A spring clean is also advisable to catch any debris that may have accumulated.
- **4. Manage Vegetation:** Cut back or remove any potentially damaging plants from behind downpipes.
- **5. Inspect Rainwater Pipes:** Use a hand mirror to check for splits and cracks in old cast iron and aluminium pipes, which can often go unnoticed.
- **6. Install Guards:** Fit bird and leaf guards to the tops of soil pipes and rainwater outlets to prevent blockages.
- 7. Refix Gutters: Ensure gutters are properly aligned and not discharging water onto walls.
- **8. Replace Damaged Sections:** If any sections are beyond repair, replace them with materials that match the originals—often lead or cast iron in older buildings.
- **9. Regular Painting:** Keep cast iron components painted to prevent rust. **10. Safety First:** Avoid undertaking high-level maintenance work. Always seek professional help.





Good Money Week and New Edition of the Greener Fairer Banking Guide for Churches



If you or church are investigating how to green your finances as part of your climate mission, a new resource has been published to mark Good Money Week which may help you navigate through this complex area.

The JustMoney Movement has released a new edition of the Greener Fairer Banking guide for churches, to coincide with this year's Good Money Week (30 September – 6 October) which culminates in Good Money Sunday this Sunday 6 October. Churches are being encouraged to review their finances to ensure that their banking and investment choices correspond to their values and mission. Among the various ethical questions to be considered, many of the UK's major banks are involved in financing the fossil fuel industry and deforestation. There other options available that choose to invest positively in sustainable, planet-friendly options and are more supportive of the needs of churches and charities.

The updated guide compares four of the more ethical banks with current accounts suitable for churches and charities in the UK, including an analysis of the banks' climate policies. The guide can be downloaded for free here: https://justmoney.org.uk/resources/new-greener-fairer-banking-guide/

Spiritual Abuse Webinar





URC Safeguarding is delighted to be hosting a one-off webinar with Dr Lisa Oakley focusing on Spiritual Abuse.

Dr. Lisa Oakley is an Associate Professor at the University of Chester. She is also the Chair of the National working group for abuse linked to accusations of witchcraft and spirit possession and the Church of England Task and Finish Group on Spiritual Abuse and acted as a core participant to the independent inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse. Lisa has conducted research into issues of faith, safeguarding and abuse for the past 16 years. Her doctorate was on the topic of spiritual abuse and in 2013 she co-authored a book entitled Breaking the Silence on Spiritual Abuse. In 2019 a further book was published entitled Escaping the Maze of Spiritual Abuse. Creating Healthy Christian Cultures. Lisa has presented on these topics nationally and internationally.





Accommodation with local hosts may be requested. Many venues cover their costs by charging between $\Sigma 6$ and $\Sigma 12$ for tickets. \square




