

# Anxiety levels soar among disabled people!



Proposed cuts to disability benefits are causing rising levels of anxiety among disabled people, according to Through the Roof, the Christian charity that works together with churches and people across all disabilities to advance God's kingdom.

Lynda a disabled volunteer calls on churches and the wider Christian community to be more attuned to the needs of disabled people and make adjustments that enable everyone to flourish and use their gifts to build others up:

"Let's listen to one another," Lynda encourages. "Let's hear the worries and concerns of those who are struggling. We must be aware of the resources available through organisations that can offer assistance. As a Christian community, we can provide comfort, encouragement, and hope. In Jesus's name, we are called to offer support and rest, especially in times of distress. As He said in Matthew 11:28, 'Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.'"

Through the Roof invites churches to nominate their own <u>Roofbreaker</u> (Disability Champion) to reflect on the needs of individuals and ensure disabled people can fully Access the Christian life, Belong together as God's family, and use their gifts to make disciples, for God's glory, as part of the Great Commission.

This project was started by a small group following the closing service for Heaton Way Church on October 1st, 2023. It started as a booklet to share memories of the church that had meant so much to them over the years. The purpose of the project grew as it was felt that there were lessons that could be learned by all churches as we fight to keep our churches viable in a changing world.

The Moderator says of it 'It is always sad when a church closes. But what a wonderful testimony this account provides of the faithfulness of individuals in proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ in word and in action. Through the witness of the church, lives were touched and transformed. It is important that the story is shared to encourage

disciples today and to give God the glory.'

We hope the PowerPoint presentation will be useful in local Area Groups, individual churches or in Training Sessions. 




